## UNIFORM POLICY STATEMENT

### Aims:

- To foster a feeling of unity and belonging
- To avoid unnecessary rivalry between children
- To encourage all children to wear uniform

### Requirements:

Although uniform is not compulsory it is preferred that children attend school wearing uniform. All parents are supplied with the following list:

- Grey school trousers/shorts
- Grey school skirt/pinafore dress
- White or red shirt/blouse (short or long sleeve)
- Or White or red polo shirt (short or long sleeve)
- Red and white summer dress
- Red sweatshirt/cardigan (embroidered with school logo)
- Plain Red jumper/cardigan/pullover
- Sensible black, school shoes
- Grey or white socks
- Black, red, grey or white tights

*Sportswear:* (to be kept in drawstring bag on child's peg)

*For Indoor PE:* White T-Shirt  
Red Shorts  
Plimsolls

*For Outdoor PE:* *As for Indoor PE*  
**Plus:**  
Trainers  
Tracksuit or Jogging Bottoms/Sweatshirt (*any colour*)

- We trust that parents will provide their children with suitable and sensible footwear.
- For the comfort of pupils and cleanliness of the school, children may bring plimsolls or other comfortable indoor shoes to change into before school begins.
- All items of clothing and footwear must be clearly marked with the child's name.
- All items of uniform are available at affordable prices and at a variety of outlets.

- At most times a small stock of second-hand uniform is available from the Parent Teachers Association.
