UNIFORM POLICY STATEMENT

Aims:

- To foster a feeling of unity and belonging
- To avoid unnecessary rivalry between children
- To encourage all children to wear uniform

Requirements:

Although uniform is not compulsory it is preferred that children attend school wearing uniform. All parents are supplied with the following list:

Boys:

- Grey school trousers/shorts
- White or red short-sleeved polo shirt (preferably with school logo) OR plain white short-sleeved shirt
- Red sweatshirt with school logo or plain red v neck pullover
- Sensible black school shoes (no trainers)
- Plain grey or black socks
- School baseball cap (optional available to buy from the school office)

Girls:

- Grey skirt/pinafore dress or grey school trousers
- White or red short-sleeved polo shirt (preferably with school logo) OR plain white short-sleeved blouse
- Red and white checked summer dress
- Red cardigan/sweatshirt with school logo or plain red cardigan
- Sensible black school shoes (no trainers)
- Plain grey/red tights or white socks
- School baseball cap (optional available to buy from the school office)

Sportswear - Boys and Girls:

- Plain white round necked t-shirt
- Red PE shorts
- Black plimsolls
- Trainers for outdoor PE
- Tracksuit (red/grey/navy) for colder weather
- Short, plain white sports socks
- Sportswear is required in School every day and should be kept in a named drawstring bag on your child's coat peg

- We trust that parents will provide their children with suitable and sensible footwear.
- For the comfort of pupils and cleanliness of the school, children may bring plimsolls or other comfortable indoor shoes to change into before school begins.
- All items of clothing must be clearly marked with the child's name (at the neck or waistband as appropriate) and footwear should also be clearly named.
- All items of uniform are available at affordable prices and at a variety of outlets.
- At most times a small stock of second-hand uniform is available from the Parent Teachers Association.
